



Memorial Giving

Anyone, at any time, may establish a memorial to a departed loved one, simply by making a gift. It does not necessarily mean the one whom you wish to honor was a member of this church, but simply that he or she lies close to your heart. Gifts may be made to the Memorial Fund in any amount, large or small. The name of the person memorialized will be inscribed in the Book of Remembrance. The name of the donor will be recorded also but no record of the amount of the gift will appear.

All such memorial gifts are added to the Memorial Fund, to be used in such a manner as the Memorial Committee may determine to increase the religious beauty of the church or add to its service of Christian worship. Such funds will be expended for permanent projects of a tangible nature, which may be readily identified and will not be spent on items shown in the church budget under current operating expenses. The Memorial Committee will purchase every memorial object.

Staff-Pastoral Relations Committee

Our Book of Discipline specifies each UMC congregation shall create a Staff-Pastoral Relations Committee. This committee may consist of 5-9 members, serving three year terms. Members terms are staggered to assure continuity. Despite common belief the SPRC does not hire nor terminate a pastor. The SPRC maintains privacy in all its dealings.

Current members of the SPRC are Sondra Spence, Bette Lacey, Susan Cassidy, Mike Adelman, Joanne Milloy and Rich Pearson.

The Pastor attends all meetings.

While there are 17 focus areas established for SPRCs, not all are relevant to all congregations. Most pertinent to Faith UMC include -

- 1: Encouraging and strengthening support and respect for the pastor, the staff and their families.
- 2: Meeting and advising the pastor and staff to assure effectiveness of ministry, maintaining positive relationships with the congregation, and resolving any barriers or conditions impeding the ministry.
- 3: Periodically confer and counsel the pastor and staff on matters pertaining to use of talents, skills, and time to assure effectiveness of ministry of the congregation. If needed, the SPRC may create continuing plans if any training or educational needs are identified.
- 4: Consult with the pastor and staff concerning any needs for continuing education, work-life balance, personal health and wellness, and spiritual renewal (including weekly sabbatical and annual vacation time). If necessary SPRC will arrange with AST and Trustees for time and financial assistance for pastor or staff to attend events to serve their professional and spiritual growth.
- 5: Confer with the pastor if it becomes apparent the best interests of the congregation and pastor will be served by a change of pastor. The committee shall cooperate with the pastor, the district superintendent, and the bishop to secure a clergy person.
- 6: Review proposals for compensation, travel expense, vacation, health and life insurance, pension, parsonage expenses.
- 7: The SPRC chair, the chair of the Trustees, and the pastor shall make an annual review of the church-owned parsonage to assure proper maintenance and to give immediate resolution to parsonage issues affecting the family's health and well-being.
